PULPIT SUPPLY - SEPTEMBER 1ST



Next Sunday, September 1st, we will be visited by Vicar Aaron Dawson who will be preaching and presiding at service. Vicar Aaron, originally of Benton, Illinois, is currently serving as Acting Pastor at St. John Lutheran Church in Metropolis, Illinois, with permission from the General Secretary. Vicar Aaron holds a Bachelor of Arts Ministry from the Institute of Lutheran Theology where he is currently working on the last year of his Master Divinity. The Vicar began serving Trinity Lutheran Church in Shumway, Illinois, due to their pastoral vacancy in 2020 at the request of General Secretary Mark

Chavez. In 2022, Trinity and St. John's of Shelbyville formed a two-point parish that served as his internship site. Upon completion of his internship, Vicar Aaron went to serve St. John Lutheran Church of Metropolis, Illinois.

Vicar Aaron was accepted into the NALC candidacy process in 2020. In October, he will appear before the candidacy committee for his final interview to be approved for ordination. As soon as he is approved, he will be allowed to enter the call process a semester before graduation.

Vicar Aaron will be accompanied by his lovely wife, Kristin. Kristin, who is originally from Metropolis, Illinois, is a Board-Certified Music Therapist and holds a Master of Music Therapy from Saint Mary of the Woods College in Terre Haute, Indiana. They will be bringing their 15-month-old son, Asher.
