Based on Matthew 20

Moment by moment, day by day, season by season, life by life, we're called to be generous, for Jesus' sake, with our time, talent, treasure and testimony.

Whose is it? Shaping a vision for generosity and giving is always grounded in this one simple yet profound truth—God who created everything, owns everything. Living a life of generosity is especially difficult because even though we may be more than willing to intellectually acknowledge God owns everything, on a daily basis we do not functionally live this way. As long as we live in the flesh, we have to daily wrestle with the lingering ghosts of our own selfishness. St. Augustine said it well, "God is always trying to give good things to us, but our hands are too full to receive them."

In the Parable of the Workers, after a few disgruntled employees complain that they worked more hours than a new hire and yet all received the same pay, the owner of the business goes on to say, "What's it to you. It's my business. It's my money to spend and invest anyway I see fit. Are you going to be envious and resentful because I chose to be generous? So, the last will be first and the first last."

Jesus' words "the last will be first", "whoever saves his life will lose it" and "if you want to be truly free, you must be a slave to all" echo the same trajectory. The human heart, our flesh truly struggles to let go. Jesus words require of us a self-emptying and a self-sacrifice. And yet our hearts cry unfair and unjust. I earned it all. It's mine.

Think about it for a moment, we are consumed with "this is mine"—my life, my career, my home, my vision, my church, my pastorate, my ministry, my investment portfolio and my rights. Do you see how this mindset, "this is mine," is so embedded in our thinking that at times we don't even recognize we're saying such a thing—it is our default.

Shaping a vision for stewardship begins and ends with the generosity of God. God is Giver. Although he owes us nothing, God gives us everything and His giving is flawless. When we look at the parable of the workers, entry into God's kingdom is not gained by how many hours we work, or how hard we strive to perfect and acquire more fame, fortune or power. Entry into the Kingdom is solely by God's generosity.

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES

JUNE 18, 2024

Call to order at 7:30 p.m. with opening prayer led by DeAnn McMorris. Approval of last month's minutes was made by Ron Howe second by Shirley Friemel. Additional agenda items. New guidelines were set for approval of bills to be paid not to exceed \$2,000 without board approval. Motion by J.R. Sipes, second by Ron Howe. Motion carried. Discussed sound board issues, motion was made by Shirley Friemel, second by Ron Howe, to hire SENERGY electric technologies to troubleshoot sound system board to include reprogramming board, testing inputs and outputs, and all cabling systems not to exceed \$5,000.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> - Gave approval to DeAnn to move funds around to be more fiscally responsible. Some funds have been in accounts earning no interest. All budget line items are good except for Supply Pastor. Those funds will be coming from Pastor's Salary line item. Also, parish nursing purchased new pads for ADT which were outdated. The decision was made not to pay off the old mortgage and use some funds for more pressing maintenance issues.

Pastoral Acts - Funerals: Sandy Ackerman (6/5); Darrel Meuser (6/7)

Ministry Team Reports - Reports available upon request.

<u>Building Team</u> – Devin Cox had Duden & Silver come in and perform routine maintenance on all heating and air-conditioning units for church. One geothermal unit had a pump leaking. Devin noted that seven geothermal units are approximately twenty years old. Would be around \$16,000 per unit to replace.

Disaster Response Committee Report – St. John's of Danforth helped resupply some items.

<u>Elder's Report/ALC Foundation Report</u> – Old piano was disposed of. ALC Foundation report minutes were submitted.

Old Business

- a. John is revisiting bid from M&R builders for floor repair in youth hall and cost to replace flooring.
- b. Looking into cabinet for bells and paraments.

New Business

a. Convocations will be held online this year for 3 hours. DeAnn McMorris and Sally Bauer will be our representatives this year.
