SEASON OF ORDINARY TIME



The season of Ordinary Time begins the Sunday after Pentecost Sunday and lasts until Advent. Ordinary Time is known in the church both as Ordinary Time or the Sundays after Pentecost. The season of Ordinary

Time can be broken into two sections: Summer Pentecost and Fall Pentecost.

Ordinary Time is the season of everyday. There is nothing exciting that happens during Ordinary Time. Rather, we focus our energy on the ordinary, the daily rhythms and patterns, finding and noticing God—how God is with us, for us and works through us in everyday moments. The season is marked by the color green.

On the back of the pulpit of my internship church was the sign above that says, "We Would See Jesus." The sign was a reminder that while sharing God's Word from the pulpit we also pause to see Jesus in the faces of those who are receiving the Word. The reality is that each and every one of us need this reminder. We all get caught up in the hustle and bustle of our daily lives that we may not notice where God is actively involved in our everyday. Instead, we think that God only acts in big and monumental ways instead of the ordinary everyday, which is not true. Or that God doesn't care about us because we don't sense Him present in our lives, which is also not true. The fact is God cares deeply about each and everyone of His beloved children. God is engaged in our daily lives but we may not be aware.

As we move through the season of Ordinary Time, the time where we simply go about our day-to-day lives, it is good for us to pause and take notice of God. To slow down our pace and notice what God does for us and how God works through us and others every day. When we do this, we notice that God is in the faces, hands, voices and hugs of others. That God is in the bird chirping on the branch outside our office. That God is in the silence. That God is grounding you when your emotions are overwhelming. That God is right beside you in everyday moments.

So, let's join each other in this season of Ordinary Time in the practice of noticing God. Each day, pause and notice God, then share with your family or a friend where you noticed Him. Share it loud around the dinner table, in your journal, or on social media. Before long we will be noticing God in many ways and be drawn even closer to Him. Amen.

*On Sunday, September 1st, we will be visited by Vicar Aaron Dawson who will be preaching and presiding at service. Vicar Aaron, originally of Benton, Illinois, is currently serving as Acting Pastor at St. John Lutheran Church in Metropolis, Illinois, with permission from the General Secretary. Vicar Aaron holds a Bachelor of Arts Ministry from the Institute of Lutheran Theology where he is currently working on the last year of his Master Divinity. The Vicar began serving Trinity Lutheran Church in Shumway, Illinois, due to their pastoral vacancy in 2020 at the request of General Secretary Mark Chavez. In 2022,

Trinity and St. John's of Shelbyville formed a two-point parish that served as his internship site. Upon completion of his internship, Vicar Aaron went to serve St. John Lutheran Church of Metropolis, Illinois.

Vicar Aaron was accepted into the NALC candidacy process in 2020. In October, he will appear before the candidacy committee for his final interview to be approved for ordination. As soon as he is approved, he will be allowed to enter the call process a semester before graduation.

Vicar Aaron will be accompanied by his lovely wife, Kristin. Kristin, who is originally from Metropolis, Illinois, is a Board-Certified Music Therapist and holds a Master of Music Therapy from Saint Mary of the Woods College in Terre Haute, Indiana.
