THE CHRISMON TREE which started as a Lutheran tradition in the 1950s, is set up during Advent--a time when Christian churches prepare to celebrate Jesus Christ's birth. Unlike traditional Christmas trees, Chrismon trees are decorated only with clear lights and centuries-old symbols-decorations made from white and gold material. "Chrismon" is a combination of the words "Christ" and "monogram," and means "symbols of Christ.' The gold and white Chrismons represent majesty and purity.
