Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ. Last month I talked about the core values of the NALC. They are Christ Centered, Mission Driven, Traditionally Grounded, Congregational focused. This month's article will focus on being mission driven, how the NALC differs from the ELCA,

and what the NALC does for our local congregation.

The ELCA's 2009 General Assembly is notorious for being the meeting where they voted to ordain homosexual ministers. Most people don't remember that there were other groundbreaking decisions made at that meeting. One such decision was the stop of all Pioneer Missions (meaning missions to countries, tribes, and civilizations outside of the United States). Their argument was that Mission work of this kind is a form of cultural appropriation and was therefore ethical. This is in violation of Jesus's command to "go forth into all the world and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:16-22)."

We are called to proclaim the Gospel to all people both near and far. To that end the NALC has several programs to assist with both. The broadest of these programs is the Global Workers Network. Global Workers are Missionaries who work around the world. They have been vetted by and are supported through the NALC. By doing this the NALC prevents scams and misappropriation of funds by those pretending to be missionaries. They also insure that missionaries are cared for and receive much needed support.

On a smaller scale, the NALC supports national missions like Disaster Response. The NALC supports warehouses in key locations which keep supplies for disasters. This one is personal for us at ALC because we house a Disaster Response warehouse here. These are just a couple examples of the larger mission programs the NALC supports.

In addition, we have mission districts. As you may know, rather than having local synods as the ELCA did, we have mission districts. Unlike a synod which exists independently of a mission district with an appointed bishop, the collection of congregations in a particular area constitute the mission district and elect a dean from among their clergy. There are 25 congregations that make up our district, the Great Rivers Mission District (GRMD). The first responsibility of the mission districts is the care and preservation of the individual congregations. The Dean acts as an

extension of the Bishop's office to assist in the placement, care, and discipline of pastors. He presides over the Mission District Executive committee and assists to organize events for the district. The district itself supports statewide missions. The GRMD offers scholarships for seminarians, retreats for pastors and lay people, and supports our local Disaster Response warehouse. In addition, we are currently working on a weekend youth retreat which I myself have had a hand in.

Finally, for the local congregation, the NALC provides resources and networking for our own events. Hypothetically, if we decided we wanted to start a soup kitchen (or any other mission project) here at American, the NALC would offer resources for legal protection, structuring events, devotional, and more. They would help connect us to other congregations who have done similar missions successfully. If needed, they may even be able to offer a grant to help financially.

At every possible level, the NALC proves to be driven by missions. While many of them are social service, they remain Christ Centered as I explained last month. The reason for all our missions is to further the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We are very blessed to be a part of a congregation that is so devoted to going out and doing. 
WHITE PARAMENTS

Call to order on March 18th at 7:07 p.m. by J.R. Sipes, opening prayer by Pastor Aaron.

Guests present: Neal White & Jack Spitz who presented information concerning a new sound and projection system for the Sanctuary. Between two companies contacted, they recommended Picture Perfect from the Champaign area. Discussion was held about an LED Audio and Video Wall System with funds already available in the budget. A motion to present to the congregation to pursue the system with said company was made and passed.

Treasurer's Report: 13.2% has been used so far from the budget, largely due to repairs needed for the Geothermal system. Otherwise, we are in good shape.

Ministry, Benevolence & Foundation Reports: All included.

Disaster Response: A work session was scheduled for Thursday 3/20 at 10:15 a.m. to assemble 50 Health Kits and 50 Kitchen Kits. New online training opportunity for

NALC Spiritual Care Volunteers. Those individuals would accompany mission teams assigned to provide clean-up/rebuilding efforts.

Old Business:

- a. Stage removal is in progress. When done, the painters will come back to paint.
- b. The painting of the Youth Hall has had many positive comments.
- c. A 3rd party flooring inspector came to assess the problems with the new flooring in the north end. Comments from him seem to concur there were issues, but no response had been received yet from Flooring Surfaces.

New Business:

- a. A motion was made and passed to accept the recommendation from Worship and Music Committee that Kristin Dawson be recognized as a music accompanist on staff payroll. The Committee also recommended she be recognized as the Vocal & Handbell Coordinator to be paid a rate TBD which was tabled until more details are available.
- b. There are a couple classrooms in the north end that have an excessive amount of unwanted items that need to be disposed of soon.
- c. The ALC custodian is moving out of state and her last day is March 21st. No replacement had been determined yet.


