Kristin and I were blessed to be asked to serve as Liturgist and musician for the NALC's first ever youth leadership camp. The event was called Building Youth Leaders who are Disciples (BYLD for short). This event is designed for youth who are seeking deeper discipleship or discerning a call to ministry. This event was significant for our congregation for two reasons. First, We took Aubrie Albers and Andrew Peck as participants. Aubrie was able to make new friends and explore deeper discipleship. Andrew spent the week with other pastors and decided to answer the call to the Holy Office of Word and Sacrament Ministry. Both of these young people will be exploring ways they can serve God in our congregation. Second, our memorial committee graciously contributed funds to the NALC Youth and Family Ministries. These funds were used to help fund BYLD. This helped to provide each student with books and materials, pay travel expenses for volunteers, and cover other expenses. At the end of the week we polled our 18 participants and found that 10 of them (including Andrew) are actively discerning a call to ministry. Once again, ALC has directly contributed to the formation of Pastors.

BYLD will happen on odd numbered years. The Continental Youth Gathering (CYG) is a larger event which will happen in even numbered years. Please keep these youth in your prayers as they grow in faith and calling. As I always say, our youth are not the future of the church, they are as much the church as you and I. SHEETS NEEDED The Quilting group is still accepting donations of flat cotton sheets. These are used for liners in the quilts. Donations may be brought to the church office.


WOMEN'S FALL BIBLE STUDY

THE SEASON OF PENTECOST PARAMENTS



The season of Pentecost paraments have been raised in our main sanctuary. Their purpose is to enhance our worship of our God and Giver of Life and to direct our thoughts toward living lives which bear the fruits of the Holy Spirit who came to us and dwells within us.

The paraments are primarily green in color since they are for the season of Pentecost, normal time in the Church calendar, and one reflecting growth in nature and spirit. This is a season in which we should be intentional toward our growth in faith and discipleship. Tradition calls for an emphasis on missions during the season of Pentecost.

One of the goals in the pattern of the banners was to represent the fruits of the Spirit, but it is hard to capture love, joy, peace, and gentleness in a visual and tangible form. Our prayer is that the flames of fire representing the Holy Spirit who came to humanity on day of Pentecost, the blue waters of baptism, and the dove descending help capture some of the events that bring the fruit of the Holy Spirit to our lives and testimonies.

Reading the story from the left panel, Jesus the Christ, the bread of life, and our Midwestern roots are represented by the wheat stalks. The flames of fire are descending upon the people of God. In panel two the fellowship of believers is represented by the circles. The squares below them are blank, showing the emptiness within our hearts and lives when we don't know Jesus. The cross is also represented in this panel and continues over to the third panel. The empty spaces in our lives are becoming filled with the Holy Spirit as we come to the cross. We continue to be refined by the flames of the Holy Spirit. In the fourth panel, we see the dove descending to us, the circle of God's completeness; eternity, the symbol of eternal victory over death by and through Christ. The purple colors in the third and fourth panel reflect Jesus Christ's royalty as He is King of Kings and Lord of Lords. He has ascended to the right hand of the Father. We, too, rise in newness of life from the waters of baptism and through the baptism of fire. We, the adopted children of the living God, have received the gift of living water from and through Jesus, our Lord. This is represented

throughout the four banners with the flowing waters dancing - portraying the abundant life found in Christ and our joy when walking with God.

The pulpit and lectern hangings and the stoles reflect the same themes. The Luther Roses with the green Pentecost background, which are located on the candlestick bases of the altar, reflect our Lutheran heritage. The Luther Rose tells a story of its own which can be found in other reference material.

The parament committee hopes that your reflection upon the themes represented in the banners will enhance your worship experience and bring you ever closer to our Savior, Jesus the Christ.
